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BoG-40.1.0 PROCEDURAL

BoG-40.1.1 To confirm the minutes of the 39th meeting of the Board of Governors held on October 11, 2023.

The minutes of the 39th meeting of the Board of Governors held on October 11, 2023, approved by the Chairperson, BoG were circulated to all Board members through email on November 01, 2023, for comments. No comments have been received on the minutes.

BoG-40.2.1 To ratify the decisions / actions taken by the Chairperson, Board of Governors on the recommendations of the Director/designated Committee, on behalf of the Board of Governors:

BoG-40.2.2 To note other developments at the Institute.

(i) To report the status of filling up of backlog vacancies in the teaching cadre.

The Ministry of Education, Department of Higher Education has intimated all the IITs to implement the Central Educational Institutional (Reservation in Teacher's Cadre) Act 2019. Further, the Ministry vide DO Letter No.33-2/2021-TS-III (Pt.I) dated August 24, 2021, has instructed all IITs regarding filling of backlog vacancies in a mission mode.

The Process of recruitment for getting the best candidates from reserved categories is taken up in mission mode through Special Recruitment Drives (SRD) as well as Standing/Specific advertisement mode in which some of the selection processes have been completed and few are under process.

The current status of Faculty recruitment is as under:

(ii) Details regarding Global Tender Enquiry (GTE) Proposals.

As of date, the following are the approved cases of GTE by the MoE to be reported to the Board:

- 16 Channel EEG System with cap, electrode, and amplifier -Qty. 1 No., for an estimated cost of ₹ 16,80,000/-.
- Chips (Integrated Circuit) Qty. 50 Nos., for an estimated cost of ₹ 7,20,000/-.

In addition to the above, one case for procurement of Itasca Software FLAC 2D v 9.0 - Qty. 1 No., costing ₹ 11,00,000/- approx. (Initiated by the SRIC Section) and another procurement case viz. High-Performance Optical Spectrum Analyser - Qty. 1 No., costing ₹ 40,00,000/- approx. (Initiated by the S&P Section) are under consideration for approval of the MoE.

BoG-40.3.1 34th meeting of the Finance Committee held on July 29, 2023.

The 34th Finance Committee meeting of the Institute was held on July 29, 2023, at IIT Mandi. The minutes of the meetings are enclosed as **Annexure-4; Pages No. 29 to 35.**

BoG-40.3.2 40th meeting of the Building & Works Committee (B&WC) held on June 22,2023.

The 40th Building & Works Committee (B&WC) extension meeting of the Institute was held on November 02, 2023, at IIT Mandi. The minutes of the meetings are enclosed as **Annexure-5; Pages No. 36 to 41.**

BoG-40.3.3 Recovery of interest on Mobilization advance from CPWD.

CPWD executed various works at IIT Mandi under phase-1. CPWD was given mobilization advance of ₹ 16,55,45,900/- as per MoU. Interest earned (₹ 3,10,57,645/-) on the mobilization advance was deposited by

CPWD in the revenue head of GOI instead of crediting to the project account of IIT Mandi.

B&WC in its 40th extension meeting deliberated that CPWD should credit interest to IIT Mandi at the earliest.

B&WC further recommended to report the matter to BoG.

BoG-40.4.0 AGENDA ITEMS

BoG-40.4.1 Presentation by the School of Biosciences and Bioengineering (SBB).

The Chairperson, School of Biosciences and Bioengineering (SBB) will give the presentation on the status/updates/plans of his School.

BoG-40.4.2 To consider the damages of IIT Mandi due to recent heavy rains and proposed protection measures for the future.

The heavy rains and flash floods that occurred during July-August 2023, caused immense damage to the existing infrastructure of IIT Mandi whose initial estimate is ₹ 3,40,00,000/- as given in Table 1. (Annexure-6; Pages No. 42 to 57). This matter was reported in the 40th B&WC meeting held on September 06, 2023. The remedial measures that must be taken, so that such calamities do not hamper the existing infrastructure is also presented to the B&WC.

The objectives of providing these remedial/protective measures are the following:

- To protect existing hostels, research labs, academic blocks, and residential buildings by constructing gabion walls and protection walls.
- 2. To restructure the existing drainage system on both campuses of IIT Mandi.

The approximate cost of remedial measures is ₹ 67,19,00,000/- as given in Table no. 2 (Annexure-7; Pages No. 58 to 83). B&WC has approved this estimate and recommended it to FC and BoG for approval.

B&WC further recommended to FC/BoG for approval.

Accordingly, the matter is placed before the Board for consideration.

BoG-40.4.3 To consider the resolving GST rate to settle the bills with NBCC, PMC of IIT Mandi.

NBCC has executed various works at IIT Mandi for phase 1 and 1x as the Project Management Consultancy (PMC). Final bills for the works are to be settled as per the agreement between IIT Mandi and NBCC. NBCC provided documents/bills showing that the contractors have paid 18% GST against the existing rule of 12% GST during the period 2017-2021.

As the NBCC contractors have already submitted GST @ 18% to the GST department and the period for the revision of the GST return has already lapsed, hence B&WC in its 40th extension meeting recommended settling the bills with NBCC based on 18% GST subject to the production of undertaking by NBCC that the GST paid by contractors are @18% and the

contractors have not claimed refund of the excess GST paid by them. B&WC recommends this proposal to FC and BoG for approval.

The B&WC minutes are placed in Annexure-5; Pages No. 36 to 41.

Accordingly, the matter is placed before the Board for consideration.

BoG-40.4.4 To consider the funds' source for married research scholar cum project employees.

Originally, in 36th meeting, BoG approved the construction of a married hotel with an amount of ₹ 10,00,00,000/-, construction agency IIT Mandi and funds source HEFA Term Loan - II. However, in the 38th Meeting, BoG approved the construction agency as CPWD.

The Institute has submitted the closure report of HEFA Term Loan-II. Therefore, it is proposed that the funding source may be considered as HEFA Term Loan - III.

Accordingly, the matter is placed before the Board for consideration.

BoG-40.4.5 To consider the works for the development of new assets and infrastructure to be constructed at IIT Mandi.

As approved in the 38^{th} BoG meeting, a general memorandum of understanding (MoU) has been signed between IIT Mandi and CPWD to construct new assets and infrastructure in phase -2 under HEFA Term Loan $\gtrless 3,33,72,00,000/$ -.

To bring in efficiency as well as timely completion, B&WC in its 40th meeting agreed to the proposal to select other PMCs as per General Financial Rules (GFR).

B&WC further recommends to FC and BoG for approval.

Accordingly, the matter is placed before the Board for consideration.

BoG-40.4.6 To assess and deliberate on the existing Special Travel Facilities for Faculty and Staff, prompted by concerns raised in the recent Audit Report.

Considering the remote location of the institute, in the year 2013, a provision of special travel facilities was extended for various purposes, including medical travel, home travel, LTC, etc. for the employees of the institute with the provision for a review of the policy after five years or until dedicated connectivity is established, whichever is earlier (**Annexure – 8; Pages No. 84 to 85)**, Copy of Notification No. IITMandi/Admn/RS-78/2013/6428-40 (24.12.2013)).

Upon completion of five years, after a review, in 2019, the special travel facility was extended for another five years for faculty and staff to visit Chandigarh/Delhi once a year, (Annexure – 9; Page No. 86, Copy of Extension dated 21.06.2019).

However, in the 2020-21 Audit, The Comptroller and Auditor General (C&AG) raised concerns about unauthorized grants of special travel facilities, amounting to ₹ 12,30,00,000/-, (Annexure – 10; Page No. 87, Copy of C&AG Audit Objection (2020-21)).

The extended duration of such facility will be over on 23.12.2023. Therefore, a committee was constituted by the Director to submit its recommendations in this matter. Keeping in view the hardship being faced by the employees due to remote location and various other constraints, the committee has recommended extending the same for a further five years (Annexure – 11; Page No. 88).

The item is placed before the Board for consideration.

BoG-40.4.7 To consider the revised proposal for Group Health Insurance.

Dr. Atul Dhar, Chair, Employee Welfare Committee has presented the agenda regarding the Group Health Insurance policy for the employees of the Institute during the Institute Standing Committee (ISC) meeting held on 16th July, 2023.

The Institute Standing Committee (ISC) after suggesting some changes, (Annexure – 12; Page No. 89 to 93) recommended the proposal to FC/BoG for consideration.

The item is placed before the Board for consideration.

BoG-40.4.8 To discuss the Separate Audit Report (SAR) on the final accounts of IIT Mandi for the FY 2022-23.

It is submitted that the Annual Accounts of the IIT Mandi for the Financial Year 2022-23 were finalized by the institute on July 30, 1023. Subsequently, the Final Accounts were submitted to the office of the CAG of India on August 09, 2023, after the approval of the Chairman, BoG for subsequent Audit, Certification of Accounts, and issue of Separate Audit Report (SAR).

The CAG of India conducted the audit of the final accounts during the period September 05 to 19, 2023, and accordingly draft Separate Audit Report (SAR) of the Accounts was received from the CAG of India office in this Institute on October 05, 2023. The reply to these observations was submitted to their office on October 17, 2023. The CAG of India considered the replies submitted by the institute over the draft Separate Audit Report and thereafter issued the Final Separate Audit Report (SAR) which was received in this institute on November 10, 2023.

The observations have been noted and its compliance will be shown to the CAG of India team at the time of the next audit as per past practice, enclosed as **Annexure – 13; Pages No. 94 to 99.**

The agenda is placed in BoG for ex post facto ratification as the final accounts duly printed 35 copies (Hindi and English versions each) have been submitted to the Ministry of Education.

BoG-40.4.9 To consider the case of Mr. Kumar Kirsh (B20295) for relaxation in fees.

Mr. Kirsh Kumar (B20295) was admitted in the B.Tech (Mechanical Engineering) programme in 2020. After fulfilling the branch change criteria, his branch changed from Mechanical Engineering to Computer Science and Engineering (vide Notification No. IIT Mandi/Acad/2021/DS-1860-66 dated 14-08-2021). Mr. Kirsh Kumar informed that he has been staying with his family for the last 10 years and his current Nationality is Pakistani. He passed the 10th/10+2 examination from India. He applied alongwith document (Business Rules 2020 for Joint Seat Allocation) to consider his seat as par with Indian National based on the following reason:

"(B) For Foreign Citizens

(i) For IITs

Candidates who are not Indian Nationals but who have studied 10+2 level or equivalent in India will be assigned category tag GEN for seat allocation to IITs. These candidates are not eligible for benefits of any kind of reservation (e.g. Gen-EWS, OBC-NCL, SC, ST or PwD)".

At the request of the student, the Academic Office raised the issue with Chair, JEE Cell IIT Mandi. Chair, JEE cell further sent the query to Chairman, JEE (Adv), New Delhi. Chairman, JEE (Adv) clarified that the seat allocated to Mr. Kirsh Kumar was under the Foreign Supernumerary seat.

Mr. Kirsh Kumar informed that his family's annual income is less than ₹ 5,00,000/-. On August 28, 2023, he sent his request to the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education for consideration of his admission to B.Tech. programme equivalent to Indian General category students.

At the Institute level, the DORA office had requested all Scholarship Scheme Partners for donations or scholarship. But there is no response from the other side.

Recently, due to non-receipt of the pending amount, the registration of Mr. Kirsh Kumar along with other students has been canceled from the programme.

In this regard, it is proposed that the fee applicable to Mr. Kirsh Kumar may be considered as par with Indian National student and he may be allowed to pay the fee equivalent to GEN category Indian National student.

At the outset, the Committee noted the comments received on behalf of the Joint Secretary (Technical Education) and JS & FA, MoE on the agenda items of meeting of the Finance Committee.

Thereafter, the agenda item was taken up as follows:

Item No. 34.1: To confirm minutes of 33rd meeting of the Finance Committee held on 10/02/2023.

It was noted that the minutes have been circulated and no comments have been received. Therefore, minutes of the 33rd Finance Committee meeting held on 10/02/2023 were confirmed as circulated.

Item No. 34.2: Action Taken Report (ATR) on the minutes of previous meetings of the Finance Committee.

Dr. Deepak Swami, Dean (Infrastructure & Services) In-charge gave a presentation on the ongoing works along with likely date of completion.

The FC advised that all the construction-related agreements should have an upper limit on cost escalation and should include stringent penalty clause.

With these suggestions, the FC noted the ATR.

Item No. 34.3: To report/intimate the developments at the Institute.

The Finance Committee (FC) noted the developments at the Institute and advised that the arbitration cases needed to be defended well and the agencies going to arbitration should be discouraged to participate in the future bids for the Institute works. Possibilities may also be explored to bear the arbitration cost by the CPWD instead of charging it to IIT Mandi.

The FC noted item no. 34.3 (v) regarding the change in the source of funds for construction of the undergraduate hostel from Institute Internal Resources instead of OH-35, as recommended by the Building and Works Committee (B&WC).

Regarding the implementation of the Vidya Lakshmi scheme, the FC recommended the payment of Rs. 1.4 crore from IRG, however FC recommended that MoE should consider the payment in this scheme from OH-31.

Item No. 34.4: To consider the proposal for creation of 50 Nos. faculty housing apartments to cater future expansion of IIT Mandi/HEFA proposal.

Minutes of the 34th Finance Committee Meeting

29th July, 2023

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B&WC in its 39th meeting held on dated 22-06-2023 has approved the proposal to build 50- 3 BHK apartments from IRG. However, based on the recent communication from MOE as well as the comment of MOE on this agenda, B&WC meeting was held on 28-07-2023 to consider a bigger infrastructure development plan under 90:10. B&WC approved the proposed HEFA loan of **Rs. 326 Crores** to construct 150 nos. 3BHK, 150 nos. 2 BHK apartments, 2 academic buildings, and a student activity centre that includes indoor sports facilities. Dean Infra presented the B&WC approved proposal to FC.

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FC recommended the proposal to BoG for approval.

Item No. 34.5: To consider the Memorandum of Understanding between the Central Public Works Department (CPWD) and the Indian Institute of Technology Mandi for Development of New assets of IIT Mandi at Kamand (HP).

Dean (I&S) In-charge briefed the Finance Committee about the item.

After deliberations, the FC advised that in addition to this general memorandum of understanding (MoU) which has been signed, a separate memorandum of agreement (MoA) should be signed project-wise with stringent penalty clauses.

With these observations, the FC recommended the proposal to the BoG for consideration.

Item No. 34.6: To consider the purchase of 6 nos. of Buses for IIT Mandi.

Dean (I&S) In-charge briefed the Finance Committee about the proposal for the purchase of 6 nos. of Buses for IIT Mandi.

The FC deliberated on the proposal and advised having an optimal fleet mix of medium (30-35 seats) and smaller (11-25 seats) capacity buses.

Further, the FC advised that the cost-benefit ratio is quite simplified and the component of depreciation, inflation etc. has not been considered. The Institute may conduct the proper life cycle analysis for the buses at its own level.

The Chairman welcomed all the members and thanked them for making themselves available for 40th Building & Works Committee Extension Meeting of IIT Mandi.

The following agenda items were taken up in the meeting:

Item No. 40.1: Finalization of Rate of GST for the works executed by NBCC.

This matter was discussed in the 40th B&WC meeting held on 6th Sept, 2023. One of the members suggested that rate of GST for all the work contracts carried out by PSUs shall remain 18% and the same was recorded in the minutes. However, on perusal it was found that no such notification has been issued by Finance Ministry of the GOI and the matter was again placed in the extension of 40th B&WC meeting.

During discussion, B&WC members agreed with the opinion of the institute's Chartered Accountant that though the GST rate is 12% between 21-09-2017 to 31-12-2021 but as the NBCC contractors have already submitted GST @ 18% to the GST department and the time period for the revision of the GST return has already lapsed, the GST returns cannot be revised now. Therefore, the reimbursement of GST to NBCC may be done @18% on work done as claimed by NBCC. However, NBCC should furnish a NOC stating that, contractor has not claimed any reimbursement of the excess GST paid to the Government.

Further, committee has decided that, the agency charges of NBCC will be paid on base value excluding GST. GST on agency charges will be paid as per rate applicable.

B&WC further recommends to FC and BoG for approval.

Item No. 40.2: Additional agenda with the permission of the chair.

i) Recovery of interest on Mobilization advance from CPWD.

A memorandum of understanding (MOU) was signed between Indian Institute of Technology Mandi (IIT Mandi) and Central Public Works Department (CPWD) Madhopur, Central division, Distt. Gurdaspur on 25th August 2011. As per MOU the IIT Mandi, vide administrative approval vide no. 8084-91 dated 23-11-2012 allotted the work to CPWD for Rs. 270.83 Cr. CPWD allotted the work to three contractors i.e. M/s

Supreme Infrastructure India Ltd. for estimated cost of Rs. 188.82 Cr., M/s Chiranji Lal Gupta & Sons Pvt. Ltd for Rs. 20.65 Cr. and M/s Ahluwalia Contractor (I) ltd. for Rs.
39.16 Cr.

As per the annual audit of IIT Mandi conducted by O/o Director General of Audit (Central) Chandigarh during Oct. 2021 para for Non-recovery of interest on mobilization advance has been raised. Referring to the same SE, CPWD vide no. 2959 dated 11-11-2021 in reference to the discussion held on 11-11-2021 at IIT Mandi campus, reiterated that interest on mobilization advance has been credited to revenue head of Govt. of India due to inadvertent error instead of crediting to the project account of IIT Mandi.

The matter to recoup the interest on mobilization advance has been perusing from CPWD since Nov 2021 vide following correspondence detailed

Fig.1A: Due to heavy rainfall, significant damage to the connectivity road from the main road to rising main crossing. The continuous rain has led to soil erosion/landslide of the approach road.

Fig.1B: Due to heavy rainfall, significant damage to the rising main water supply pipeline (150mm dia) has arisen. The continuous rain has led to soil erosion, potential misalignment, leaks and rupture of the pipeline.

Fig. 2A: Due to heavy rainfall, significant damage to WTP stage-1 and the rising main water supply pipeline has arisen. The continuous rain has led to soil erosion, which impacted the structural integrity of the retaining wall and plinth protection area of pump house.

Fig. 2B: Due to heavy rainfall, the rain water is entering inside the pump house which results in damage of the pumps installed in the pump house.

Fig.5A: Due to heavy rains, resulting in soil erosion, which impacted structural integrity of transformer and damage to the outdoor sub-station yard.


Fig.5B: Due to heavy rains, resulting in soil erosion, which damage the outdoor sub-station yard.

Fig.8C: Due to heavy rainfall, the soil erosion happened in approach road to the North Campus which creates further blockage of the road due to the landslide.





Para 07: Un-authorized grant of special travel facility to IIT employees- Rs. 12.30 Lakh.

Ministry of finance vide F.No.1/1/2016-E.III(A) dated 13th January,2017 issued an Office memorandum stating that "the autonomous organizations are expected to manage their affairs in such fashion that their dependence on Central Government for financial support to meet the extra financial implications is minimal, as such autonomous organizations are expected to be financial self-sufficient so as not to cause any extra burden on the Central Exchequer". Further, para 4 of this memorandum states that "It would be necessary to ensure the final package of benefits proposed to be extended to the employees of these autonomous organizations etc. is not more beneficial than that admissible to the corresponding categories of the Central Government employees.

As per Rule 230 (12) (i) of GFR 2017, all Grantee Institutions or Organizations which receive more than fifty percent of their recurring expenditure in the form of Grants-in aid, should ordinarily formulate terms and conditions of service of their employees which are, by and large, not higher than those applicable to similar categories of employees in Central Government. In exceptional cases relaxation may be made in consultation with the Ministry of Finance.

During scrutiny of record, it was noticed that Board of Governors in its 8th meeting held on 19th October, 2013 (item No.8.2.6) approved to grant special travel facilities to faculty & staff members of the institute for five years. IIT Mandi vide notification No. IITMANDI/Admn./RS-78/2013/6428-40 dated 24-12-2013 implemented the special travel facilities to faculty &staff members of the institute and vide even no. RS-78/2015/375-81 dated 20-04-2015 further amended the order. As per approval, the faculty members & Group A employees and their families of the institute have been granted the facility to return travel by leased or hired vehicle and other staff members belonging to Group B and C and their families by Volvo bus once in a year up to Delhi/Chandigarh. This facility has been granted ir addition to LTC and home town LTC facility (equivalent to central Govt. employees).

Scrutiny further revealed that IIT Mandi paid an amount of Rs.12,29,811/- on account of reimbursement of special travel facilities to its employees in the last two years i.e. 2019-20 & 2020-21 which was not only in contravention to the Ministry of Finance instruction, but also resulted in extra financial burden on Central Exchequer.

On being pointed out by audit, the Institute stated that special travel facilities was given to staff with the approval of BoG of IIT Mandi. The reply is not tenable as this special travel facility was in addition to the travel facilities (LTC, Home Time) available to the corresponding categories of the Central Government employees and approval/consultation from the Ministry of Finance was also not obtained. Final reply will be awaited in audit.

A meeting of the Committee constituted vide OM. No. IITMandi /F/ Administration/INT-A05/556-565 dated 18.07.2023 for reviewing the 'Daily Allowance' rates and 'one time travel facility (additional point entrusted for consideration)' to the employees of the Institute was held on 19.09.2023 at 3:00 P.M. in the Conference Room, 2nd Floor, A-9 Building, North Campus, IIT Mandi.

- 2. Review of 'One time travel facility' to the employees of the Institute:

DR (A&L) apprised to the committee members that on the recommendation of the ISC and subsequent approval by the BOG, Notification No. IITMandi/Admn/RS-78/2013/6428-40 was issued on **24.12.2013** to grant special travel facilities to Faculty and Staff members of the Institute for return travel to Delhi/ Chandigarh for medical purposes/ Home Travel/LFC or any other purpose once a year, with a provision for reviewing the policy after five years, till establishing a good & dedicated connectivity, whichever is earlier.

The <u>Special travel facility</u> was again extended vide OM No. IIT/Mandi/RO-01/2019/3484-87 dated <u>21.06.2019</u> to the faculty and staff of the Institute for a period of 5 years to visit Chandigarh/ Delhi once in a calendar year as per earlier notified entitlement other than LTC. The faculty and staff are permitted one-way journey in each direction in any order. The tenure of the one-time travel facility is valid till 23.12.2023.

DR(A&L) further apprised that C&AG has raised para in the A&I report for the year 2020-21 "*Un-authorized grant of special travel facility to IIT employees- Rs. 12.30 Lakh*" for incurring expenditure on this account.

Committee discussed and deliberated on the matter and noted that 'One Time Travel Facility' to the employees of the Institute was initially allowed for 5 years or till establishing a good & dedicated connectivity (whichever is earlier) and after a review it was again extended for another 5 years i.e. up to 23.12.2023. The committee members acknowledged that while there has been improvement in connectivity from Chandigarh to Mandi town, however, frequent landslides on the highways have been a recurring issue which led to disruption of transportation in routine. The benefit of the facility is permitted for a minimal number of occasions; therefore, the committee recommended the extension of this facility further for 5 years.

The meeting ended with the vote of thanks to and by the Chair.

INDIAN INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY MANDI Proposal for "Pan-India Cashless Medical Insurance Scheme for Present and Retired Employees of IIT Mandi"

The committee constituted to frame policies for IIT Mandi Employee Welfare Society had several meetings for framing a "Pan-India Cashless Medical Insurance Scheme for all Regular and Retired Employees of IIT Mandi". The scheme is mandatory for all Regular Employees. However, this scheme is **optional for Retired Employees**, **Contractual & Temporary Employees** of the Institute. At the beginning of the implementation of the policy, the existing employees may be given the option to opt out from the scheme if they want to continue their reimbursement of IPD treatments as per the existing CGHS rates. The details of the scheme are as follows:

The salient features of this scheme are as follows:

- 1. The coverage of hospitals will be on a Pan-India basis and it will cover an extensive list of hospital networks with significant emphasis on the inclusion of hospitals that are generally used by IIT Mandi employees in cashless mode.
- 2. The facility is available for the present and superannuated employees of the Institute (regular, contractual, consolidated and project staff etc.).
- 3. The present employee and his/her family will get annual coverage of Rs. 7.00 lakh (Rs. 5.00 lakh base + Rs. 2.00 lakh from Institute buffer subject to availability of funds in the buffer) under this policy, further revision of the coverage amount/limit based on the market scenario will be revised with the approval of the Director. The size of Institute buffer will be of 40 Lakhs for the first year of the policy and later on it may be increased with the approval of the Director. If the expenditure is more than the ceiling limit fixed per family in a financial year, then the amount exceeding the ceiling limit, will be processed for determining the maximum admissible amount based on the existing Institute rules of reimbursement of the claims. The employee can submit the claims exceeding the ceiling limit or not covered treatments in the insurance scheme for reimbursement as per the institute procedures.
- 4. The definition of "family" will be applicable as per the 'Medical Attendance Rules'.
- 5. The employees joining the Institute will have to submit details of their dependents to the office of Administration & Establishment and office of SRIC as the case may be for coverage of the dependents in the insurance scheme.
- 6. The employees retiring during the financial year will have to submit a 'consent form' to the respective Administrative Unit.
- 7. Administration Unit will serve as a nodal office for this scheme. In this regard, the offices mentioned in point no. 5 & 6, will have to submit compiled monthly list with the following details:
 - (a) Newly joined faculty members and employees with their dependents.
 - (b) Any addition/ deletion in the name of present faculty members and employees with their dependents due to various reasons.
 - (c) Any addition/deletion in the name of retired employees and his or her spouse due to various reasons. It should include a detailed breakup of all retirees covered under GPF / CPF / NPS Scheme.

- 8. The retired employee and his/her spouse (not family) will be entitled for maximum coverage of Rs. 7.00 lakh (Rs. 5.00 lakh base + Rs. 2.00 lakh from Institute buffer subject to availability of funds in the buffer) under this policy, further revision of the coverage amount/limit based on the market scenario will be revised with the approval of the Director. The entry age of retired employees is till 80 years and the renewal age is for a lifetime. The retired employees and his/her spouse whoever has attained the age of 80 years, will get similar cover under reimbursement mode from the Institute by paying similar contributions as other retirees below 80 years.
- 9. Generally in other IITs, no premium has to be borne by present regular employees. Based on the financial situation of the institute, Director will decide the fraction of the premium to be borne by present and regular employees. For the first year of the Insurance policy, all the regular employees will contribute 1% of their basic salary and remaining premium will be borne by the Institute.

In case of temporary employees (Project staff, Consolidated, Visiting professor, short term contract, etc.), the premium has to be borne by the individual. Based on the budget availability, partial premium support as decided by Director in the particular financial year may also be extended to temporary employees with low income as a welfare measure. Institute will make effort to ensure the benefits of ESIC, Ayushman Bharat Schemes etc. for outsourced employees. The contributions of employees retired from the establishment of IIT Mandi covered under GPF, CPF and NPS will be decided for applicable cases as and when required.

- 10. The beneficiaries are entitled to facilities of private, semi-private and general ward depending on their entitlement, i.e. basic pay/pension as per the directives issued from Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India.
- 11. The present and the retired employees residing in Mandi will have to seek a referral from Health Centre, IIT Mandi for all planned hospitalization cases. However, in case of any emergency, the patient can be taken directly to the hospital and post referral must be taken from the Health Centre, IIT Mandi within 72 hours of admission to the hospital.
- **12.** The present and the retired employees residing outside Mandi may avail facility directly from the hospital where they are residing or referred to and post referral must be taken from the Health Centre, IIT Mandi within 7 days of admission to the hospital.
- 13. For all the cases mentioned above in Point No. 10 &11 to seek referral is mandatory and Medical Officers attached with Health Centre, IIT Mandi may be approached for seeking referrals. This will streamline the process and facilitate the beneficiaries in settling their claims.
- 14. The other features of this scheme are as follows:
 - (a) Pre-existing disease/ conditions without any waiting time are covered from day one.
 - (b)Coverage for new employees and their dependents from day one.
 - (c) Coverage of newborn will be provided from day one.
 - (d) The reimbursement pre-and post-hospitalization expenses will be for a maximum of 30 and 60 days, respectively.
 - (e) Cashless facility up to the sum assured amount will be available in all the empanelled hospitals.

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- (f) The list of Pan-India empanelled hospitals along with list of cashless empanelled hospitals in Himachal and Chandigarh will have to be uploaded on the institute website.
- (g) Coverage of ailments/ surgeries etc. requiring one day or more of hospitalization are covered from day one. The list of exclusions is placed at **Annexure A**.
- (h) List of ailments covered under day care procedure(s) will be prepared and updated time to time with the approval of the Director (**Annexure B**).
- (i) Room rent will be as per respective entitled category subject to a maximum of Rs. 5,000/per day, further revision of the charges will be done with the approval of the Director. Patient getting treatment in the entitled category shall only be eligible for buffer amount subject to availability, if need arises.
- (j) ICU shall be limited to maximum of Rs. 7000/- per day irrespective of entitlement category and further revision in rates will be done with the approval of the Director.
- 15. In case of treatment in a hospital which is not empanelled 'OR' in case of any emergency where networked hospitals are not available 'OR' for all government hospitals, the claim will be reimbursed as per entitlement of the scheme on submission of all documents. All reimbursement claims will be routed through Health Centre, IIT Mandi for verification of referral. Health Centre, IIT Mandi will send the bills to the respective Accounts Sections of employees concerned to check the admissibility of claims for onward submission to the Insurance Company. On receipt of approval of the amount against the claim from the insurance company, the said amount will be transferred to the account of the claimant. To establish the non-availability of the empanelled hospital, a self-declaration certificate has to be submitted by the individual.
- 16. For availing cashless facility in networked hospitals where the hospitalization is planned the Insured has to make sure that he carries the Insurance Card and Institute Identity Card to the hospital. The same will be deposited with the hospital during the period of his/her treatment.
- 17. Any query in regard to this scheme document, may be addressed to the Registrar, IIT Mandi for clarifications etc.
- 18. The Institute reserves the right to make modifications/ changes in the policy as may be decided by the Director, IIT Mandi from time to time.
- 19 The Performa of various forms and other information will be devised as per the requirement.
- 20. The service provider/insurance company will be selected by way of open tendering and the empanelment of the service provider will be effective for an initial period of one year and is <u>mandatory</u> for all Present Employees and the same will be extended based on the satisfactory performance of the service provider.
- 21. Normal OPD expenses will be reimbursed to the employees as per their entitlement and prevailing rules of the GoI.
- 22. Optional scope for additional cover on the payment of additional premium by the individual as per the age profile should also be made while selecting the service provider.

Annexure A: List of Exclusions

List of Exclusions

- 1. Obesity treatment and its complications, mainly Bariatric Surgery resulting due to metabolic syndrome and diabetes if the claim documents specify BMI is below normal (25 or less) and there is documented history of uncontrolled DM with medications, only then it is payable. Else it is defined as treatment of obesity or its related complications. Only doctor's certification that surgery is required is not sufficient. Obesity treatment (Bariatric surgery) is not the target treatment for diabetes / metabolic syndrome. Capping: 50% of SI
- 2. Treatment related to all psychiatric and psychosomatic disorders INR 30,000/- capping and only IPD.
- 3. Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy may be payable during a hospitalization for: Air or gas embolism, Carbon monoxide poisoning, Clostridal myositis and myonecrosis (gas gangrene), Crush injury, compartment syndrome, and other acute traumatic ischemias, Cyanide poisoning
- 4. Maternity benefit capped at 1.00 Lakh only.

Financial Implications of Adopting this Policy

In the 53rd meeting of IIT Council item no. 53.9, IIT Council approved payment of insurance premium upto 18000/ year for employee and his eligible dependents. The scheme includes the provision for the payment of extra premium for the employee from the salary. If the Institute opts for the payment of group medical insurance premium in a particular year then no bills for the hospitalisation will be reimbursed during that year for the employee and the dependents. Hence, the limit set by IIT council allows for contribution of INR 18000 from IIT Mandi per

Hence, the limit set by IIT council allows for contribution of INR 18000 from IIT Mandi per employee.

- It also links the amount of contribution from Institute with the DA. Based on current rate of 38% DA, the institute contribution can be up to INR 25000/-

Based on the suggestion of ISC, quotations for group medical insurance were invited from 4 insurance companies. The quoted amount was INR 19,000-32,000 per family for annual insurance amount of INR 4 Lakhs per year.

For current employee number, the annual expenditure on medical reimbursement is around 35 Lakhs (60 percent of this expected to be expenditure on IPD).

Based on the feedback of the employees the cover is increased to 5 Lakhs for all employees. It is expected that after open tender cost of health insurance premium will be around INR 20,000/- for one employee. After meeting out the partial expenses (about half from the 1% basic salary contribution from the employees), institute will contribute around INR 10,000 towards the premium of one employee. Current expenditure on the reimbursement of the IPD bills of the employees is around INR 8000/ year-employee. This will amount to about ~4 Lakhs/ year (2000 per employee) extra expenditure on the IPD with reference to current expenditure on medical reimbursement.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of the Indian Institute of Technology, Mandi (Himachal Pradesh) for the year ended 31 March 2023

We have audited the Balance Sheet of the Indian Institute of Technology, Mandi (Himachal Pradesh) as at 31 March 2023. Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 23(2) of Institutes of Technology Act, 1961 as amended by Institutes of Technology (Amendment) Act, 2012. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification. conformity with the best accounting practices. accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law. Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cumperformance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports. CAG's Audit Reports. separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that:

 We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;

ii) The Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this Report have been drawn up in the format prescribed by the Ministry of Human Resource Development. Government of India vide order No. 29-4 2012-I'D dated 17 April 2015.

iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Indian Institute of Technology, Mandi (Himachal Pradesh) in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.

iv) We further report that:

A Balance Sheet

A.1 Sources of Funds

Current Liabilities & Provisions (Schedule III) Current Liabilities Statutory Liabilities: ₹ 205.39 lakh

(i) Above did not include liability against demand raised of tax dues for short deductions of TDS and interest there against amounting to ₹ 4.30 lakh for the years 2019-20 to 2021-22 (₹2.13 lakh) 2022-23 (₹2.17 lakh). This has resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities by ₹ 4.30 lakh as well as Administrative and General Expenses by ₹ 2.17 lakh and Prior Period Expenses by ₹ 2.13 lakh.

(ii) As per the prescribed format; balances of sponsored projects are to be shown under head 'Receipts against sponsored projects' and balances of unutilised grants are to be shown under head 'unutilised grants'. It was pointed out in the Separate Audit Report for the year 2021-22 (comment A.3) that 'unutilized grants in aid' shown in Schedule 3 were included Receipts against sponsored projects' under head Sponsored Research Industrial Consultancy (SRIC) which should have been shown under head 'Receipts against sponsored projects' instead of 'unutilised grant in aid'. Despite being pointed out in the previous year, SRIC balances amounting to $₹10.90^{1}$ erore were continued to be shown under head 'unutilised grant in aid' instead of 'Receipts against sponsored projects'. This has resulted in overstatement

of unutilized grants and understatement of liabilities under Sponsored Projects by ₹10,90 erore.

Moreover, SRIC project balances on account of 'workshop and other activities' amounting to \mathfrak{T} 1.77 erore were not recorded in annual accounts. This has resulted in understatement of Receipts against Sponsored Projects as well as Current Assets by \mathfrak{T} 1.77 erore.

B. Contingent Liabilities and Notes to Accounts-Schedule XXIII

Reference is invited to note no 3.3 (e) of Schedule XXIII where in it has been stated that arbitration award amounting to Rs 1.11 crore have been accepted through the implementing agency CPWD. Accordingly, these have been charged to respective assets during the year.

However, the disclosure given by the Institute was found incorrect as amount of the arbitration award amounting to ₹ 1.11 crore was not charged in the annual accounts for the year 2022-23. Further, payment was made to CPWD in July2023 for depositing in the High court and for filling appeal against the award.

C. General

C.1 Net impact of Audit comments on the Annual Accounts

Net impact of Audit comments on the Annual Accounts of the Institute for the year ending 31 March 2023 is as under:

- Assets understated by ₹1.77 crore;
- ii. Liabilities understated by ₹1.81 crore;
- iii. Corpus/ Capital Fund overstated by ₹0.04 crore;
- iv. Deficit for the year understated by ₹0.04 crore.

C.2 As per the prescribed format, each schedule forming part of the balance sheet should depict the comparative status of the balance for the current year as well for the previous year.

However, the Institute has not shown comparative balances for the previous year 2021-22 in respect of Schedule-10 Grants/ Subsidies (Irrecoverable Grants



Received). Schedule-3C (Unutilized Grant from Government) and Receipt and Payment Account.

D. Grant-in-Aid

Out of total available funds of ₹199.40 crore including previous year unspent balance of ₹11.32 crore, Grant-in-Aid received during the year ₹169.01 crore and adjustments made of prior years of ₹19.07² crore; the Institute utilized a sum of ₹169.58 crore, leaving an unutilized balance of ₹29.82³ crore at the end of the year.

The Institute has recoverable grant under the head 'Grant for Repayment of Interest on HEFA Loan' amounting to ₹0.25 crore (refer to the footnote 2 given below): therefore, unspent balances of grants with the Institute were ₹30.07 crore.

E. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit report have been brought to the notice of the Institute's management through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet. Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.

vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:

 a. In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Indian Institute of Technology, Mandi (Himachal Pradesh) as on 31st March 2023; and
